PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Furkating College was established on 6th August 1981 representing the mass populated area of the Assam-Nagaland Border of Golaghat district, Assam. The people of Furkating and its adjoining area with great enthusiasm and cooperation resolved to establish an institution of Higher Education at Furkating town, the heart of a large area of 25 sq. miles. The College started functioning under the leadership of the Governing Body's founder President Late Mohen Baruah, founder Secretary Mr. Dugdha Dutta and founder Principal Late Firdus Ali Ahmed.

The College was started at Furkating High School from 22/06/1981 and later it was shifted to its own building in an area of about 9 Acres of land at the Tirual Grazing ground which was generously donated by the local people. The College is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University w.e.f. 28/07/1993.

After fourteen years of persistent effort and sacrifice of a group of well-wishers and dedicated teachers, the College obtained deficit grant-in-aid status in 1996 w.e.f. 11/01/1996 during the tenure of Governing Body President Late Nagen Neog, the then Cabinet Minister of the Government of Assam. The College was brought under provincialized system in 2005 as per provision of Assam College Employees Provincialisation Act 2005.

Presently, with the guidance of the present Principal, a group of dedicated and enthusiastic teachers, energetic ministerial staff, the College has been educating a number of pupils upto B.A. degree level and guiding the society with a clear vision. The College is determined to become a pioneer institution of higher education in the state of Assam.

A group of renowned educationists from outside the state as members of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) assessed the College in September 2003 and awarded C⁺⁺ Grade. Again, another group of educationists from different parts of India re-assessed the College in October 2010 with B Grade (point 2.63) & B⁺⁺ Grade (2.76 point) in 2016. This is an inspiration for the College fraternity to go ahead in its quest for quality, perfection and meaningful education.

Eligibility for admission

A HS passed student from the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or any recognized board may apply for admission. However, applicant must secure atleast 45% marks in the subject in which he or she desires to take honours. There will be relaxation of 5% marks for the reserved categories.

For admission in to the B.A in Economics honours, a candidate should have preferably passed the Higher Secondary Examnination (10+2) of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council or any equivalent examination with Mathematics as a subject. In case a student of Economics honours, who have not passed Mathematics in the Higher Secondary lavel, he/she shall have to opt one Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course of Mathematics of 2 credit. However, for the time being a student without Mathematics at the HS level will also be eligible for Economics honours programme.

Course structure for the BA Honours Programme under CBCS BA Honours Programme under CBCS consist of following courses:

- (a) Core Courses (Honours): These courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme. There will be 14 courses (papers) of the subject which is chosen as the core subject.
- (b) Elective courses: Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. This courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter departmental that is Generic Elective (GE).
- (c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC).: The ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds "Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses" and "Skill Enhancement Courses." AEC courses are the courses that leads to knowledge enhancement.



Reservation of Seats:

Statutory reservation policy of the government is followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

There will be 2% of seats for the students with excellance in extra curricular activities.

Attendance: 80% attandance Compulsory. a Student whose attendence is less than 80% shall not be permitted for the End Semester Exam.

A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher semester. He/she shall need to pursue semester a-fresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

Examination and Evaluation

- (a) Examination and Evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, atleast three times during each semester
- (b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End- Se mester Examnination in each course during every semester
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer script of the End-Semester Examination. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

Betterment Examination

A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examination" in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the six semester examination only once. In this case, the highar marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidate shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the sixth semester examination.

Results and progression

- (a) A candidate shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures
- (i) at lest 40% of marks in each course in the End-Semester Examinations.
- (ii) at lest 'p' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End-semester examination performance
- (iii) There shall be no separate pass mark for Internal Assessment.

A student must clear all his/her semester examinations within Six(6) Years from the date of admisssion to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.

Since the semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme on this system.



Grading system

The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the perforances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below.

The Letter Grade B+ and above shall be considered as First Class and letter Grade B shall be considered as Second Class

A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a latter grade other than F (Failed) or Abs (absent/Incomplete.)

If a candidate secures F Grade in a course, he/she shall have to re-appear in the course in the next legitimate chance.



Co-Curricular Activities:

The college gives utmost importance to co-curricular activities of the students so that they can show their talents to the fullest extent. They are encouraged to participate in various district, state & inter-college competitions.

NCC:

The facility of NCC for Girls as well as Boys is available in the college. Interested students may contact the respective teachers in-charge for enrolment.

NSS:

Interested students may contact the Teacher in-charge to be member of NSS unit of the college.

Study Circle:

The Study Circle is a body constituted by students and teachers of the college for all round development of students. The circle organizes seminars, workshops, debating, quiz etc. The Study Circle hosted memorial lectures in the memory of founder Governing Body President Late Mohen Boruah from 1998 to 2009. All students of the college are considered as member of the Furkating College Study Circle.

Information and Career Guidance Cell (ICGC):

The ICGC provides information of vacancies in various departments, public sector undertakings, opportunities for higher education, scholarship and training etc. Besides guiding the students in selecting appropriate course, it conducts training for self- employment.

Women Cell:

The Women Cell awares the students of women issues and works for the welfare of women in particular and of the surrounding area in general.

Red Ribbon Club:

To promote awareness about AIDS and encourage for blood donation, a Red Ribbon Club has been formed under the banner of Assam State AIDS Control Society, Guwahati.



College Health & Sanitation Club:

It works for clean and hygiene environment under Swach Bharat Mission.

Debating Competition:

The college organises Late Narayan Chandra Dutta Bi-annual All Assam Inter-College Prize Money Debate Competition.

Admission Committee:

An Admission Committee is constituted by the college authority to conduct entire admission process following Government reservation policy for the reserved category students such as ST(P), ST(H), SC, OBC, MOBC etc. There will also be reservation of 2% seats for students showing outsranding performance in extra curricular activities.

Boys' & Girls' Hostel:

The College provides hostel facility to limited number of students on merit basis. Interested students should apply in Hostel Admission Form.

Identity Card:

The college authority issues Identity Cards for each student immediately after commencement of the classes.

College Uniform:

The uniform prescribed for the students are –

<u>For Boys:</u> Light Yellow shirt, Blue Trouser, Black Socks, Black Shoe & Maroon Blazer or Sweater.

For Girls: Plain Muga Mekhela, White Chadar with Maroon border and Light Yellow Blouse or Light Yellow Kurta, Maroon Pyzama and Dopatta, Maroon Blazer or Sweater.

Students should wear uniform decently.

Library:

The College has a library with a floor area of 2500 sq.ft. half of which is used as reading room. The library at present has a stock of about 18,510 books,



subscription to 14 magazines and 3 Journals of regional, national and international importance as well as 7 Newspapers. Digital library facility has also been made available. There is a Library Committee for smooth conduct of the activities of the library.

Mentoring:

Attendence:

At least 80% attendance is mandatory as per regulation of DU. There is an Attendance Monitoring Committee which takes measures to check low attendance.

Examination and Evaluation:

Examination and Evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis.

Internal Assessment:

In internal assessment different tools are employed such as written test, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses.

Scholarship and Award:

The College provides all sorts of the State and Central Govt. scholarships such as National Merit, State merit, Differntly able, SC/ST, TGL, OBC/MOBC to deserving students. Besides these scholarships, the College offers late Annada Borah Memorial Award to the best student of HS Final Examination provided by Mr. Jogeswar Borah, Late Tanuram Saikia (former Governing Body President)



Memorial Award to the best student of TDC Final Examination provided by the family members of Late Tanuram Saikia. All the departments provide cash award to the student securing the highest mark in their respective subject.


