

STUDENTS' FEEDBACK (2018-2019)

The Feedback Report is prepared on the basis of the feedback form responses extended by student respondents of the college issued to them for the session: 2018-2019.

CHART ANALYSIS





Findings:

- 93% of student respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course content in the syllabus for the concerned subject, whereas, 7% say that they are not satisfied.
- 89% of the students think that the courses are relevant for them, whereas, 11% do not agree with the view.
- 51% of the students think that the prescribed courses for concerned subject have more scope for introducing new courses in future; on the other hand, 49% respondents say that there is less scope.
- Only 53% respondents think that the existing programme is enough to meet their requirements for employability or job placement but 47% do not agree with the view.
- 93% respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college, whereas, 7% students say that they are not satisfied.
- 93% respondents think that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days for completing the syllabus and 7% do not think it provides.
- 76% students responded that they get support from the teachers in regard to the completion of courses in the syllabus, whereas, 24% say that they don't.
- 98% student respondents say that the teachers use ICT in Classroom teaching hours and only 2% say no.
- 80% respondents say that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the subject available in the college Library, whereas, 20% say that they are not satisfied.
- 85% respondents say that they are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities provided in the college Library; on the other hand, 15% say that they are not.
- Regarding Q. No. 13, suggestions for further development of the present curriculum,
 59% student respondents have extended their suggestions and 41% have not recommended any suggestions.
- Regarding response to the question numbers three and five (03 & 05) 54% respondents have suggested and 46% have not suggested in Question No.14.

Suggestions for Question No. 13& 14 put forward by student respondents:

- 1. The curriculum should have more elective subjects.
- 2. The College should introduce more new subjects like Home Science.
- The Curriculum should have scope of introducing practical training/internship for all the existing subjects. It should be more application-based rather than mere examinationbased.
- 4. The college should introduce Vocational programmes.
- 5. Syllabus should be regularly updated with relevant topics keeping ahead the present-day demand.


- 6. More skill-based courses for employability should be introduced by the college.
- 7. The college should have more digital classrooms.
- 8. The college should think of introducing B.Ed and PG programmes
- 9. The course content in the syllabus should have papers with new approaches.
- 10. Additional books/journals/ references in the course content should be increased to large volume.
- 11. Additional teachers should be recruited for better curriculum delivery in some subjects.
- 12. Extra reading room at the library and more computers for e-learning.

ALUMNI FEEDBACK (2018-2019)

FINDINGS

93% of the Alumni respondents think that the course content in the syllabus is relevant for them whereas, 7% respondents did not find it relevant.

93% of the respondents said that the course content was able to fulfill their expectations but 7% did not agree with the view.

91% respondents agreed that the syllabus was able to stimulate their critical thinking but 9% respondents did not find the syllabus help in their critical thinking.

As to the innovative approach of the syllabus 71% respondents agreed to the view and 29% did not agree.

14% of alumni think the programme/stream they studied has helped them in their employability and placements and 86% respondents do not think that it has helped them.

71% Alumni respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college. On the other hand, 29% Alumni respondents said that they are not satisfied.

97% respondents said that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the subject available in the college Library, whereas, 3% are not satisfied with the books in the library.

96% respondents showed their satisfaction with the E-Learning facilities provided in the college Library but 4% alumni express their dissatisfaction.

In connection to suggestions asked in Q No. 09 for further development of the present curriculum is concerned, 14% respondents only have extended their suggestions and 86% respondents have not recommended any suggestions.

Suggestions extended by the Alumni respondents:

- 1. The syllabus should incorporate new papers that have innovative approach.
- 2. New programmes like Science, Commerce and B.Ed should be initiated by the college.
- 3. More option for certificate courses should be given attention.
- 4. Additional books/journals/references should be made available in the library.

TEACHERS' FEEDBACK (2018-2019)




Findings:

- 19. 100% teacher respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course in the syllabus of their concerned subject.
- 20. 100% respondents are of the opinion that they are satisfied with the allocation of lectures in terms of the courses in the syllabus.
- 21. 100% teacher respondents think that the existing syllabus is relevant for students.
- 22. 64% of respondents think the existing syllabus has been designed to inculcate ethical and human values of the students and 36% of teachers don't agree with the view.
- 23. 86% respondents think that the syllabus has scope of stimulating critical thinking of students, whereas, 14% say that it has no such scope.
- 24. 100% of respondents think that the syllabus needs frequent revision to keep up the pace of the changing world.
- 25. 86% of respondents are of the view that the prescribed courses for their concerned subject have more scope to introduce new courses, whereas, 14% think that it has no scope.
- 26. 43% of teacher respondents think the existing programme is enough for the students to meet their requirements for employability; on the other hand, 57% of them say that the existing programme is not enough.
- 27. 100% of teacher respondents say that they are satisfied with the certificate courses that are presently going on in the college.
- 28. 100% respondents think the college has sufficient infrastructural facilities to carry on its curriculum delivery.

- 29. 86% teachers think the college has student friendly administration for effective curriculum delivery and 14% are of the view that the college has not friendly administration for effective curriculum delivery.
- 30. 100% teachers are of the opinion that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days to complete the syllabus.
- 31. 93% teachers say that they take several measures to complete the syllabus within the stipulated time, whereas, 7% remains neutral about the question.
- 32. 100% of the teacher respondents say that they take remedial measures for the weaker students so that they also can cope up with changing educational environment and all-round development.
- 33. 36% of respondents say that they use ICT daily in classroom teaching, 57% uses weekly and 7% say that they use monthly.
- 34. 93% teacher respondents are satisfied with the quality of books/journals/references of their subject available in the college Library, whereas, 7% are not satisfied.
- 35. 100% teachers are of the opinion that they are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities available in the Library.
- 36. Regarding suggestions to overall questions 57% teachers have put forward their valuable suggestions; on the other hand, 43% teacher respondents have not extended any suggestions.
- Some notable suggestions extended by the teacher respondents are highlighted below-
 - More Skill-Based Programmes should be introduced.
 - 2. Subjects like Psychology and Home science should be included in the curriculum.
 - 3. PG and B.Ed programmes should be introduced.
 - 4. Streams like Science and Commerce should be introduced
 - 5. Syllabus should be designed to inculcate ethical and human values of the students.
 - 6. Employability based courses for the students should be emphasized.
