

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STUDENTS' FEEDBACK (2019-2020)

The Feedback Report is prepared on the basis of the feedback form responses extended by the student respondents of the college issued to them for the session: 2019-2020.

CHART ANALYSIS



Furkating College

Findings:

98% of student respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course content in the syllabus for the concerned subject, whereas, 2% say that they are not satisfied.

95% of the students think that the courses are relevant for them, whereas, 5% do not agree with the view.

33% of the students think that the prescribed courses for concerned subject have more scope for introducing new courses in future; on the other hand, 67% respondents say that there is less scope.

49% respondents think that the existing programme is enough to meet their requirements for employability or job placement and the rest 51% of respondents think that it cannot meet their requirements.

88% respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college, whereas, 12%student respondents say that they are not satisfied.

95% respondents think that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days for completing the syllabus and 5% do not think that it provides.

89% students responded that they get support from the teachers in regard to the completion of courses in the syllabus, whereas, 11%says that they don't.

96% student respondents say that the teachers use ICT in Classroom teaching hours and only4% say no.

63% respondents say that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the subject available in the college Library, whereas, 37% say that they are not satisfied.

79% respondents say that they are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities provided in the college Library; on the other hand, 21% say that they are not satisfied.

Regarding suggestions for further development of the present curriculum, 73% student respondents have extended their suggestions and 27% have not recommended any suggestions.

Regarding response to the question numbers three and five (03 & 05) 18% respondents have suggested and 82% have not suggested in Question No.14.

Few notable suggestions for Question No. 13 & 14 put forward by student respondents:

Tourism and Archaeological study should be included in the History subject.


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- 2. Geography subject should be introduced as Major or Core subject in the college.
- 3. The College should introduce new subjects like Home Science and Psychology.
- 4. Sports should be taught to the students as a separate subject in the classroom.
- 5. More Skill-based/Vocational courses should be added to the existing ones to meet student's employability.
- 6. The College should use more ICT for curriculum delivery.
- 7. The college should introduce new streams and MA courses.
- 8. The syllabus should have separate papers on Gender and Environment in each subject.
- 9. Sufficient books/journals/ references in the course content should be increased to large volume.
- 10. Shortage of books should be sorted out to cope up with the CBCS curriculum.
- 11. Additional teachers should be recruited particularly in the subject, Sociology.
- 12. Boys' hostel should be constructed to facilitate the students from remote areas.

ALUMNI FEEDBACK (2019-2020)

FINDINGS

93% of the Alumni respondents think that the course content in the syllabus is relevant for them whereas, 7% respondents did not find it relevant.

97% of the respondents said that the course content was able to fulfill their expectations but 3% did not agree with the view.

96% respondents agreed that the syllabus was able to stimulate their critical thinking but 4% respondents did not find the syllabus help in their critical thinking.

As to the innovative approach of the syllabus 93% respondents agreed the view and 7% did not agree.

63% of alumni think the programme/stream they studied has helped them in their employability and placements and 37% respondents do not think that it has helped them.

75% Alumni respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college. On the other hand, 25% Alumni respondents said that they are not satisfied.

98% respondents said that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the subject available in the college Library, whereas, 2% are not satisfied with the books in the library.

98% respondents showed their satisfaction with the E-Learning facilities provided in the college Library but 2% alumni express their dissatisfaction.

In connection to suggestions asked in Q No. 09 for further development of the present curriculum is concerned, 38% respondents only have extended their suggestions and 62% respondents have not recommended any suggestions.

Suggestions extended by the Alumni respondents:

- 1. Specialists/Experts should be involved in syllabus designing to incorporate new ideas, courses and papers catering to the need of the present-day demand.
- 2. To introduce more courses, both self-financed and elective subjects, related to cultural aspects like music and drama.
- 3. Post Graduate classes should be introduced.
- 4. Vocational Education should be made compulsory in Educational system.
- 5. Job-oriented courses should be given attention in the course content.


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TEACHERS' FEEDBACK (2019-2020)

The Teachers' Feedback report is prepared on the basis of the Feedback Form responses extended by the Teacher Respondents of the college.



Findings:

- 1. 100% of teacher respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course in the syllabus of their concerned subject.
- 2. 100% respondents are of the opinion that they are satisfied with the allocation of lectures in terms of the courses in the syllabus.
- 3. 100% teacher respondents think that the existing syllabus is relevant for students.
- 4. 67% of respondents think the existing syllabus has been designed to inculcate ethical and human values of the students and 33% teacher say they it has not been designed in that way.
- 5. 83% of respondents think that the syllabus has scope of stimulating critical thinking of students, whereas, 17% say that it has no scope of stimulating critical thinking of students.
- 100% of respondents think that the syllabus needs frequent revision to keep up the pace of the changing world.
- 7. 92% of respondents are of the view that the prescribed courses for their concerned subject have more scope to introduce new courses, whereas, 8% think that it has no scope.
- 8. 33% of teacher respondents think the existing programme is enough for the students to meet their requirements for employability; on the other hand, 67% of them say that the existing programme is not enough.
- 9. 100% of teacher respondents say that they are satisfied with the certificate courses that are presently going on in your college.
- 10. 100% respondents think the college has sufficient infrastructural facilities to carry on its curriculum delivery.
- 11. 92% teachers think the college has student friendly administration for effective curriculum delivery and only 8% are of the view that the college has not friendly administration for effective curriculum delivery.

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- 12. 100% teachers are of the opinion that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days to complete the syllabus.
- 13. 58% teacher say that they take several measures to complete the syllabus within the stipulated time, whereas, 42% remains neutral about the question.
- 14. 100% of the teacher respondents say that they take remedial measures for the weaker students so that they also can cope up with changing educational environment and all-round development.
- 15. 25% of respondents say that they use ICT daily in classroom teaching, 58% uses weekly and 17% say that they use monthly.
- 16. 100% respondents are satisfied with the quality of books/journals/references of their subjects available in the college Library.
- 17. 100% teachers are of the opinion that they are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities available in the Library.
- 18. Regarding suggestions to overall questions 50% teachers have put forward their valuable suggestions, on the other hand, 50% teacher respondents have not extended any suggestion.

· Some notable suggestions extended by the teacher respondents are highlighted below-

- o Journal like 'India Quarterly' should be available in college Library.
- Existing programme should be designed to meet the requirements of student's employability in future.
- o Relevant and UGC-CARE listed journals should be made available in the college Library.
- More and more new programmes should be introduced targeting employability of the students.

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
