

Findings:

- 100% of student respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course content in the syllabus for the concerned subject, whereas, 0% say that they are not satisfied.
- 99% of the students think that the courses are relevant for them, whereas, 01% do not agree with the view.
- 50% of the students think that the prescribed courses for concerned subject have more scope for introducing new courses in future; on the other hand, 50% respondents say that there is less scope.
- Only 98% respondents think that the existing programme is enough to meet their requirements for employability or job placement but 02% do not agree with the view.
- 97% respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college, whereas, 3% students say that they are not satisfied.
- 93% respondents think that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days for completing the syllabus and 7% do not think it provides.
- 98% students responded that they get support from the teachers in regard to the completion of courses in the syllabus, whereas, 2% say that they don't.
- 97% student respondents say that the teachers use ICT in Classroom teaching hours and only 3% say no.
- 90% respondents say that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the subject available in the college Library, whereas, 10% say that they are not satisfied.
- 95% respondents say that they are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities provided in the college Library; on the other hand, 5% say that they are not.
- Regarding Q. No. 13, suggestions for further development of the present curriculum, 34% student respondents have extended their suggestions and 66% have not recommended any suggestions.
- Regarding response to the question numbers three and five (03 & 05) 54% respondents have suggested and 46% have not suggested in Question No.14.

Suggestions for Question No. 13& 14 put forward by student respondents:

- 1. The curriculum should have more elective subjects. It should include cultural studies.
- 2. The College should introduce more new subjects like, B.Ed.
- 3. The Curriculum should have scope of introducing practical training/internship for all the existing subjects. It should be more application-based rather than mere examination-based.
- 4. The college should introduce Vocational programmes.
- 5. More skill-based courses for employability should be introduced by the college.
- 6. The college should have more digital classrooms.



Findings:

- 1. 95% of teacher respondents say that they are satisfied with the prescribed course in the syllabus of their concerned subject, whereas 5% are neutral regarding this concern.
- 2. 100% teacher respondents think that the existing syllabus is relevant for students
- 3. 60% respondents are of the view that the prescribed courses for your concerned subject have more scope to introduce new courses whereas 30% percent think that it has no scope and 10% are neutral
- 4. 55% Respondents agreed that the programme is enough to meet employability of the students, 40 % is not agreed and 5% are neutral.
- 5. 85% respondents are satisfied with the certificate courses of your college; whereas 10 % are not satisfied and 5% are neutral.
- 6. 95% teachers are of the opinion that the Academic Calendar provides sufficient teaching days to complete the syllabus, 5% are neutral in this regards.

- 7. 30% teachers say that they take several measures to complete the syllabus within the stipulated time whereas 20% do not take any measures and 50% remains neutral about the question
- 8. 100% of the teacher respondents say that they take remedial measures for the weaker students.
- 9. 25 % teacher respondents daily use ICT tools in the classroom, whereas 60% use weekly and 15 %
- 10. 70% teacher respondents are satisfied with the quality of books/journals/references of your subject available in the college Library whereas 30% are not satisfied.
- 11. 100% teacher respondents are satisfied with the e-learning facility available in the library.
- Some notable suggestions extended by the teacher respondents are highlighted below-
 - 1. Skill-Based Programme, like Entrepreneurship Development; Digital Marketing should be introduced.
 - 2. Subject like Psychology, Archaeology should be included in the curriculum.
 - 3. B. Ed course need to be introduced.
 - 4. Courses of Assamese DTP, Film Appreciation, Translation Studies should be introduced.
 - 5. Inter-disciplinary classes will help in better understanding for the students.
 - **6.** Employability based courses such as for the students should be emphasized.
 - 7. Students should be encouraged for research oriented activity by introducing courses related to research methodology, and data analysis etc.
 - 8. More emphasis may be done on the study the ethnic diversity of Northeast India, Women studies, Human Rights etc. in the syllabus.



97%respondents rated that they are satisfied with the Certificate Courses available in the college. On the other hand,03% respondents says that they are not satisfied.


