


FEEDBACK REPORT: STUDENTS' FEEDBACK (2023-24)

- 92% of student respondents are satisfied with prescribed course content of their subject; whereas, 1% is not satisfied and 7% are neutral regarding this matter.
- 78% of the students are satisfied with the quality and relevance of the course included into the curriculum; whereas, 17% have responded as not satisfied and 5% is neutral.
- 65% of the students think that there is more scope to introduce new courses; on the other hand, 17% respondents do not think so and 24% is neutral.

- 67% students respondents think the existing programme enhance employability of students,
 5% respondents do not think so and 28% are neutral.
- 86% student respondents are satisfied with the Add on/ certificate courses presently going on in the college; whereas 2% has responded as not satisfied and 12% are neutral.
- 64% respondents think that the academic calendar provide sufficient teaching days to complete the syllabus; whereas, 23% students do not think so and 13% are neutral.
- 76% student respondents have agreed that they get support from teachers in completing the syllabus; 11% say no and 13% are neutral.
- 78% respondents are satisfied with the mentoring process for their academic and emotional growth; on the other hand, 5% are not satisfied and 17% are neutral.
- 82% respondents say that college takes initiative for their career guidance; 3% say no and 15% are neutral.
- 70% respondents are satisfied with the infrastructural facilities provided by the college; 14% are not satisfied and 11% are neutral.
- 70% respondents are satisfied with the ICT used by teachers in the classroom teaching but 15% are not satisfied and 15 % are neutral.
- 64% respondents say that they are satisfied with the quality of the books/journals/references of the concerned subjects available in the college Library, whereas, 23% say that they are not satisfied and 14% is neutral.
- 58% satisfied with the E-learning facility available in the library; whereas, 25% are not satisfied and 17% are neutral.

Suggestions put forward by student respondents:

- 1. Regarding introduction of new courses the college should introduce Computer Application courses, Physical Education, Home- Science and Soft Skill courses.
- 2. The duration of Add-on courses should be increased.
- 3. Introduction of Ph. D will help the students for further study in research.
- 4. Additional books/journals/ references in the course content should be increased to large volume.
- 5. Required to develop the infrastructural facilities such as more classrooms and e-learning facilities for better academic performance.





- 100% of teacher respondents are satisfied with the prescribed course in the syllabus of their concerned subject.
- 90% of teacher respondents are satisfied with the allocation of lectures in terms of the courses in the syllabus, whereas, 10% are neutral with the view.
- 80% of the respondents think the syllabus has scope of stimulating critical thinking as
 well as ethical and human values of students; on the other hand, 10% respondents think
 that the syllabus is not adequate and 10 % are neutral.
- 90% respondents think that there is more scope to introduce new courses but 10% do not agree with the view.
- 90% respondents rated that the existing programme enhances employability of students, whereas, 10% say no.
- 90% respondents are satisfied with the certificate courses presently going on in the college and 10% are neutral.
- Only 20% respondents think the college has sufficient infrastructural facilities to carry
 on its curriculum delivery, whereas, 50% say that they are not sufficient and 30% are
 neutral.
- 10% of teacher respondents daily use ICT in Classroom teaching, 50% use weekly and 40% use monthly.
- 100% respondents think the college has student friendly administration for effective curriculum delivery and 10 % are neutral regarding this matter.
- 100% respondents think the Academic Calendar provide sufficient teaching days to complete the syllabus
- 50% respondents take measure to complete the syllabus if it remains incomplete and 50% responded to be neutral.
- 80% respondents take remedial measures for the weaker students; whereas 20% do not take any measures.
- 60% respondents are satisfied with the quantity and quality of books, journals, references
 of the concerned subjects available in the college library, 30 % are not satisfied and 10 %
 are neutral.
- 70% respondents are satisfied with the E-Learning facilities available in the Library, 10 % are not satisfied and 30 % are neutral

Suggestions for Question No. 15 put forward by student respondents:

- 1. Need infrastructure.
- 2. Library needs more reference books for academic upliftment of the students.
- 3. Need proper E- learning facilities in library especially for students.
- 4. Sufficient Classrooms with modern amenities need to be emphasized.
- 5. Should have more scope for stimulating the critical thinking of students.
- 6. It's a new journey for the college as an autonomous institution. The more we go ahead the newer experiences we would get which will be helpful for us to make the college even better in different directions.




FEEDBACK REPORT: ALUMNI FEEDBACK (2023-2024)

- 89 % of alumni respondents think the course content in the syllabus was relevant, whereas 4% of the respondents do not agree with the view and 7% are neutral.
- 82% respondents think the course content could fulfill their expectations, whereas 3% thinks that the content could fulfill their expectations and 15% are neutral regarding this matter.
- 78% respondents think the syllabus was able to stimulate their critical thinking, whereas 7% do not think so and 15% are neutral regarding this matter.
- 78% respondents are satisfied with the certificate courses of the college and 22% are neutral.

- 77% respondents say that the programme they studied helped in their employability, 4% says that it did not help and 19% are neutral.
- 92 % respondents agree that the college offers student friendly ambience in curriculum transaction, on the other hand 4% says that it is not student friendly whereas 4% are neutral.
- 96% respondents are satisfied with the initiative taken by the college for their career guidance; hence 4% are neutral on this matter.
- 96% respondents agree that the extra-curricular activities inculcated social competence and personal growth, whereas 4% are neutral.
- 89% alumni believe that the college provides sufficient infrastructural facilities for the students and 11% are neutral regarding the matter.
- 82% respondents were satisfied with the quality of the books /journals/ references of your subject available in the college library; on the other hand 7% were not satisfied and 11% are neutral.

Suggestions regarding curricular transaction put forward by alumni respondents:

- 1. The College library should increase the volume of reference books.
- 2. The college should provide courses for competitive exams.
- 3. The college should focus more on skill based courses for creation alternative career options.




